Shore Team to maintain control of restricted area for duration of event to include: maintenance of boundaries, ensuring dinghies are made race ready within the designated boat compound, to control launch/recovery times (in accordance with race schedule) ensuring sailors are wearing appropriate PPE and social distancing where possible, to provide radio contact with afloat support crews offering assistance when required, liaison with emergency services and preparation of area for evacuation of casualty (if required), monitoring restricted area for non-compliance and taking resultant action, ensuring trolleys are returned to compound once dinghies have been launched, ensuring time spent within compound is kept to a minimum, maintaining a record of sailors leaving the area to ensure all participants are accounted for.
